


Past participants

International

Students from all countries are eligible. The Moot involves a dispute arising out of a contract of sale between two countries that are party to the United Nations Convention on Contracts for the International Sale of Goods (CISG). The contract provides that any dispute that might arise is to be settled by arbitration in Danubia, a country that has enacted the UNCITRAL Model Law on International Commercial Arbitration and is a party to the Convention on the Recognition and Enforcement of Foreign Arbitral Awards (NY Convention). The arbitral rules to be applied rotate yearly among the arbitration rules of co-sponsors of the Moot.

The Moot is intended to stimulate the study of international commercial law, especially the legal texts prepared by the **United Nations Commission** on International Trade Law (UNCITRAL), and the use of international commercial arbitration to resolve international commercial disputes. The international nature of the Moot is intended to lead participants to interpret international commercial law in light of different legal systems and to develop an expertise in advocating a position before an arbitral panel composed of arbitrators from different legal systems.



Team Rules

- 1. Each participating law institution may enter only one team.
- 2. Teams must be a part of a law school, university, or an institution that provides law as part of their curriculum.
- 3. A team is composed of (but not limited to):
- 3.1 At least one team coach; other faculty members and Deans are also welcome.
- 3.2 Two or more students registered at the institution (although it is highly recommended to include 4 participating students). This will mirror the experience of the Vis Moot in Vienna.
- 3.3 There is no maximum limit on the number of students who may be members of the team.
- 3.4 Students need not be from the country in which the institution is located.
- 3.5 Students who have been licensed to practice law are not eligible to participate, except with written permission of the Vis Middle East Pre-Moot Project Chair at the BCDR-AAA.
- 3.6 The winning team of the oral phase of the Vis Pre-Moot is the team that wins the Final Round.
- 3.7 Each team must submit a written Claimant and Respondent Memorandum in response to the Vis Moot Problem.

Certificates will be presented to all team members and arbitrators during the Awards Ceremony on 14th February 2013.
