Sharing a Binder

- ❖ Best way to demonstrate to your arbitrators that you work great as a team
- ❖ Turn to sources/record as your teammate goes through their argument
- ❖ If argument goes “off-outline” try to predetermine where they will need to go in their binder – this is why it is important to **KNOW YOUR TEAMMATE’S ARGUMENT**

TIME CARDS

- ❖ Make time cards to let your teammate know how much time they have left – 7 minutes, 3 minutes, 1 minute, out of time
- ❖ Make sure teammate sees time cards
- ❖ If the the arbitrator gives teammate more time, make sure to keep track



Sharing Notes

- ❖ Keep a notepad or piece of paper between you and your teammate during the argument
- ❖ If your teammate is struggling with a question and you know what the arbitrator is asking for, write them a quick note. For example:
 - ❖ Suppliers are not considered “third parties” for purposes of Article 79(2) – Schlechtriem
- ❖ Make notes of possible arguments to counter opposing teams argument
